Highlights from the presentation include:

- 1. Tyler Union Waterworks offers TUF Grip mechanical joint restraints
- 2. Restraints are UL approved from 3 to 24 inches and FM approved from 4 to 12 inches
- 3. Restraints are supplied from 3 to 48 inches for DIP and 3 to 36 inches for PVC pipe
- 4. Restraints include wedge torque nuts that twist off at a designed torque range
- 5. Restraints are color coded: black for DIP and red for PVC
- 6. TUF Grip uses 50% fewer wedges than other restraint suppliers, so easier installation
- 7. TUF Grip works by rolling friction, which allows the wedges to activate with lower torque and reduces the potential of damaging the pipe's inner wall
- 8. Clow valves and hydrants are made from scrap metal that is melted and refined
- 9. Clow valve machine shop is located in Oskaloosa, lowa
- 10. Clow offers wet barrel and dry barrel hydrants. Wet are more common and preferred
- 11. Clow offers a break-off check valve on wet barrel hydrants to prevent loss of water and property damage
- 12. Clow offers 2 to 48 inch diameter resilient wedge gate valves
- 13. All valves are hydrostatically tested at twice the rated pressure for added safety

Flow-Liner: New from Flow-Liner comes: Neofit, a portable pipe lining system that is certified to NSF 61-G standards. Neofit is a trailer pipe lining system that is capable of lining water service piping with inside diameters from 0.39 to 1.77 inches and up to approximately 110 feet long.

Projects Discussions:

Jimmy Dang of Kennedy/Jenks discussed a HDPE/PVC project that will take place in Pacifica, California. The project involves the construction of over 3,000 feet of 12 to 14 inch diameter pipe and includes bore and jack, bridge crossings, contaminated sites. The work starts in February, 2011. J&B is the Contractor for the project and will select the pipe material at the kick off meeting that takes place next week.

Water Pease from the City of Pittsburg discussed a \$5 Million sewer relocation project that will reroute sewers from residential back yards to the street right-of-way. The relocation project is at the 65% stage and the bid is anticipated in May 2011.

Rich Terrazas of Black & Veatch discussed a very interesting high pressure pipeline project in Chile for a Copper Mining Company. The project involved the design of high pressure pipelines in excess of 1,500 psi and pump stations to transmit desalination water from the western coast up the Andes Mountains. Many different variables were reviewed in the design from best lining and coating for high pressure pipe to best lining and coating for difference in elevation that is also related to temperature.

Mike Garcia of HOBAS Pipe discussed plant tour of the HOBAS Pipe plant in Houston, Texas on Thursday, January 27, 2011.
